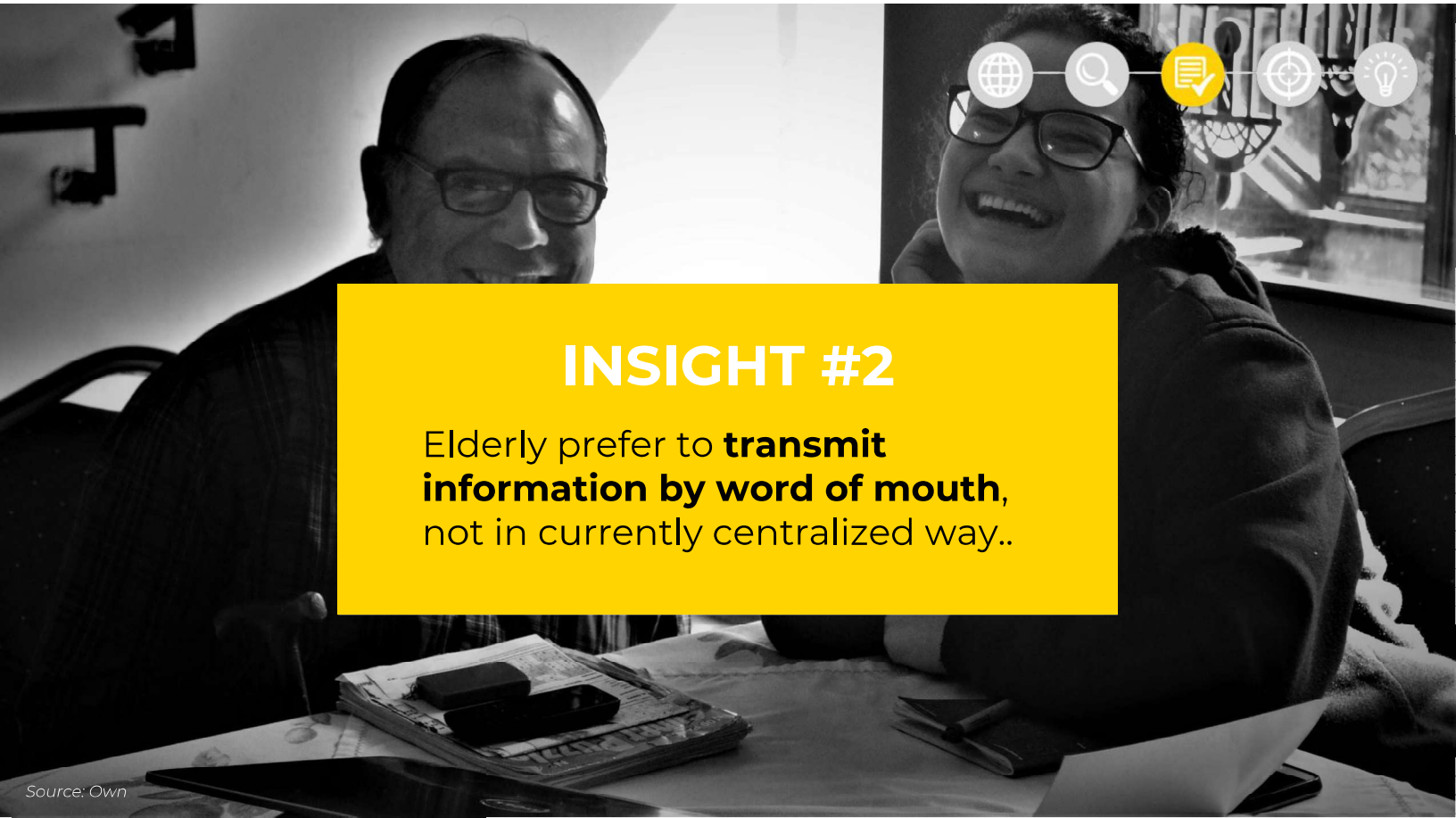




## INSIGHT #1

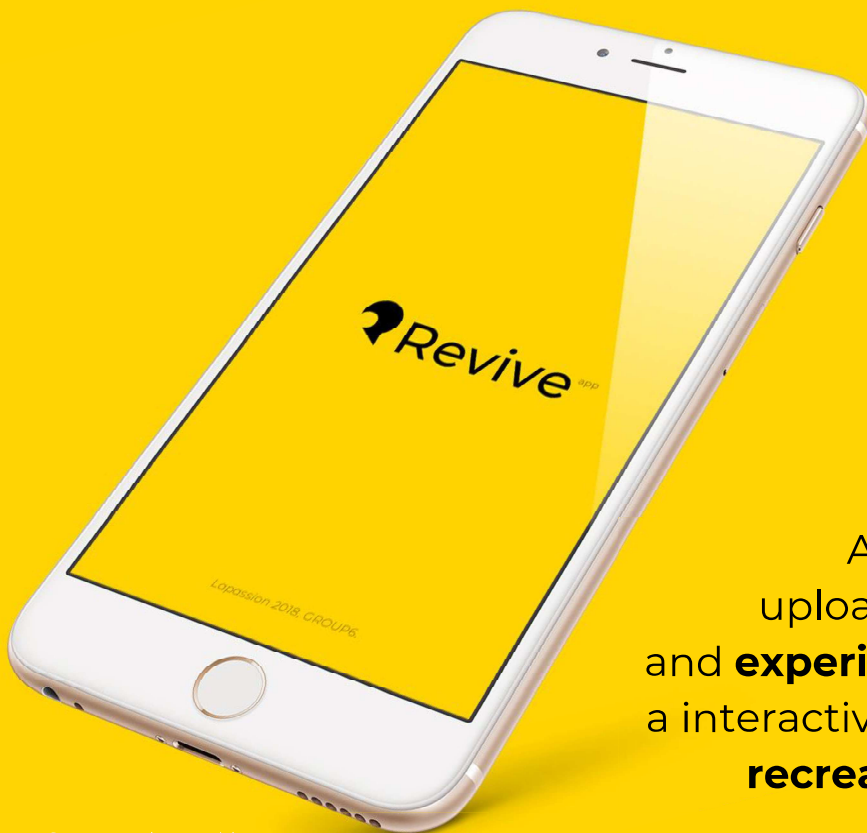
## OPPORTUNITY

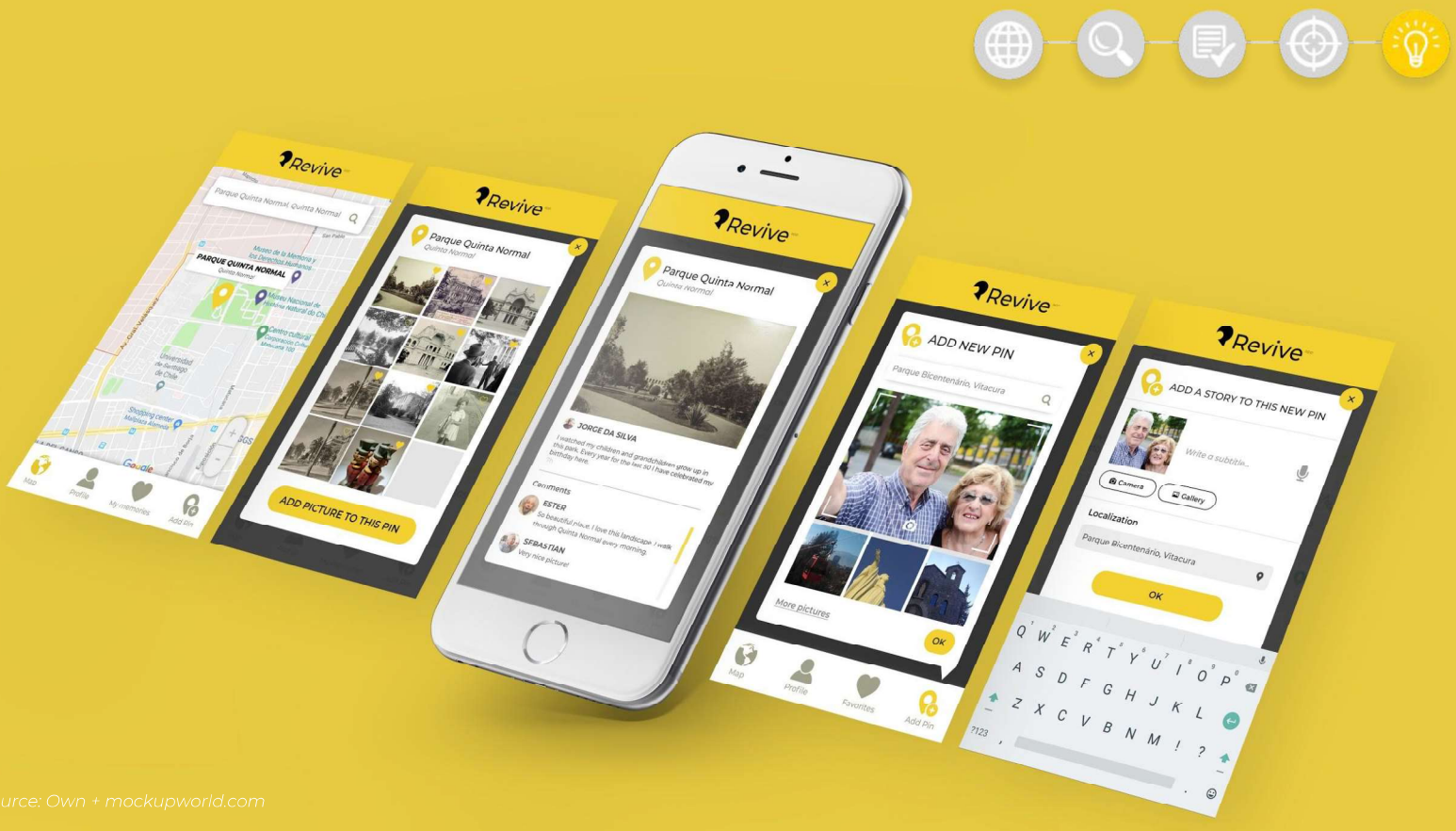
